PASTOR'S THOUGHTS:
Feb. 3-4, 2018

I am finished with my 1st month of being your Pastor and all is well -- well sort of. We are still in the cleaning process of cleaning, fixing and re-organizing areas in our buildings, and things are looking good. I wake up every morning and I thank God for our good Staff and dedicated volunteers; they lighten my work! Just a couple of things that still un-nerve me, viz., the over-half a million dollar total replacement of our air conditioning system and the updating of our sound system. As I continue getting to know our church parish lay out the list of things to do keeps on going longer and longer. But I have trust in God and in all of you. I do, I do, I do!

This past weekend was **Catholic Schools Week**. As part of our mission and ministry, we support St. Joseph Elementary School as an extension of our witness to the gospel and our faith. Let us continue celebrating the gift of Catholic education and support our parents, faculty and staff.

Last week, our young people received the Seal of the Holy Spirit from Bishop Fabre at **Confirmation** on Wednesday night, January 31st at 6 PM. Let's keep them in our prayers as God call them to discipleship and ministry. May God bring into completion what He has begun in all of them!

I would like to ask all those involved in Liturgical Ministry who received an invitation from us for the **Ministers' Gathering** scheduled for February 17,th to please respond as soon as possible. We need a headcount of how many will be attending this gathering. Thanks!

These past weekends we have been hearing the Scripture message of how urgent and important it is for us to respond to God's call. Just like the first apostles and early disciples of Jesus, they all have "abandoned everything" and "followed Him" the moment Jesus called. Last weekend, the Scriptures told us of God's plan to call us to Himself: God promised to send us prophets to lead and guide us, as long as we responded to God faithfully before our time runs out in trying to follow the examples of

Jesus.

And so the Scriptures asked, "*What are you going to abandon in order to follow Jesus?*" And, "*Are you ready to follow Christ today?*"

Let's keep in mind that we cannot simply "hear" the Word and not "do" anything; "hearing" and "doing" are both required for discipleship. St. Benedict, the father of monasticism, made as part of their rule of life, *ora et labora*, meaning: pray and work. Even in the isolation of the monastic life, these two responses from every person are required in order to follow Christ.

As an exercise of discipleship, let us ask ourselves:

How do I pray (*ora*) and how often? The Eucharistic celebration of course is the highest form of prayer which extends to devotional prayers, private prayers, and visits to the Blessed Sacrament.

Are your prayers reflected and extended in your daily life (*labora*)? Simply put: how prayers become parts of everything that we do. As we begin a new month and before we start with Lent, let us reflect and ask ourselves, and do something.


